



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It's great game.. I am really enjoying this game! I would suggest it to any point and click adventure game fan. I've played a ton of this genre and this one has great humor, great voice acting, it's beautiful, interesting, it's challenging, but not too challenging. Really cool what they did with the ghosts in the inventory. Before buying I saw reviews about it not working, so I was hesitant, but I havent had any problems with the game functioning. I'm loving it!. This game is really good. The music is great and so is the gameplay. I really look forward to the future of this game.. Zombie Exodus is a text based game putting you in the middle of a zombie apocalyse. Now, I, as well as many others, steer clear of text based games due to them not being as fun as other games, however I was genuinely surprised by how well this game was done. The decisions in this rival those in Telltale's The Walking Dead, and you really do have to make hard decisions. Unlike Telltale's The Walking Dead, this game has 9 possible endings, many character's survival relies solely on your decisions, and your decisions REALLY DO MATTER.

The game starts off quite slow, but quickly builds up to life in a world full of zombies, bandits, and other dangers coming from every angle.

I rate this game at 9/10, and the reasons it doesn't get 10/10 are listed below:

- 1. A couple of plot points don't get resolved (depending on which ending you get). Some pretty major things happen towards the end of the game, and depending on your choices, you may or may not find out what happens/happened. I know it counts towards the realism, but when someone betrays you, and you never find out who, or when someone stays behind, and you never find out if they live or not, it kinda feels like the loose ends needed wrapping up.
- 2. A lot of the decisions come down to "Pick the smart option". This is something I like. However there is one point where the writer trades in the "Zombie survival" element for an Indiana Jones-style action sequence.
- 3. The epilogue is kinda rushed and forced. I got an ending with 9 survivors, and then the game wrapped up with 5 pages set 5 years later telling me how each of them died randomly, and gave a lot of information that wasn't needed. It's kinda like if you watched the first 5 seasons of The Walking Dead, and then had everything past that summarised in 10 pages at the end of the season 5 finale. I would've much rather had a sequel, or DLC (which is something I don't say often).

All in all, this game was highly enjoyable, and I'd definitely recommend it to anyone who enjoys Zombie stories, or interactive story and character driven games. Fair and entertaining game. Great value for the price.

REVIEW FOR NARRATIVE GAMERS (since I'm talking about the story, I'm just going to spoiler-ize everything)

I remember disliking this game when I originally played it, namely because Atrus was old and useless. The opening voiceover is quite bleak (so, Catherine is dead, too? What happened to her? Unless you read the books, I guess you don't get to know). Then you meet "Yeesha," who is nothing like the chipper young girl we met in Myst IV. In terms of story incongruities, she should totally remember you--the friend who hung out with her for a while, and ultimately saved her from becoming body-snatched by Sirrus. Instead, she's gone full-blown mystic, with face tattoos. No more "Dream"--now it's all about being The Grower, whatever that means. I found her journals incredibly frustrating to read--an attempt to be poetic that came across as convoluted and intentionally vague. They're full of nonsense about growers and the D'Ni, but none of it makes much sense unless you've read the books (or the Wiki, let's be real, here). Besides, you already know that the tablet is basically like the Arc of the Covenant in Indiana Jones (everyone wants it, but it's baaaaad. Got it).

Things pick up, however, when you meet Escher. There are echos of Myst III: Exile (an underrated game in the series, if you ask me!). Here we have another mysterious character who needs your help. His periodic appearances do liven things up, and the voice acting is quite good. He isn't as likeable as Saavedro, however. With Saavedro, you totally understood why he was irate and out for revenge (he is abandoned for TWENTY YEARS on the Age of the person who destroyed everything he loves & left him to die...so, yeah, irate). With Escher, you get some cool insights: he is very keen on power, and I quite liked the "sketches" of autopsies done on the Bahro (that's when you really know that he's not the nicest dude, even though the ominous music that pipes up every time he appears does that job pretty well). As a character, though, he's pretty much one-dimensional (he wants the tablet/D'Ni power, and is helping you because you can get it for him). We never learn any back story, such as how he knows so much about the lost D'Ni civilization. Speaking to that, it's also totally unclear what happened to the D'Ni, although we can clearly see echoes of the fall of Rome (the amphitheater that Escher tells you was for some kind of bloody conquest). Again, if you don't read the books, you're pretty much clueless about what caused that empire to collapse, or where the Bahro came from (were they predecessors to the D'Ni? Were they enslaved by them? What's with the "tree," man? So. many. unanswered. questions).

In terms of gameplay, however, you can really see improvements in the graphics. I always loved the way the sun rises and sets, and the water moves, in later Myst games (and games in general). The movement is still stilted, and the choice to use graphics rather than FMV was a poor one (they just look really, really weird, amiright?). But the worlds are beautiful to navigate. The puzzles were all quite challenging, but some of the best, logical puzzles of the Myst series. The puzzles made sense, and there were enough clues (from Escher, and lying around) that you never got stuck for long. You could easily get through this game without cheating/looking at a walkthrough, which was not the case with some of the earlier installments.

So then we get to the "happy" ending--apparently, Yeesha is now "The Grower," but we have no sense of how that is going to somehow bring back the D'Ni civilization (um, don't you need people for that?), or what the tree has to do with Writing Ages. In past installments the "power" was all the D'Ni language--the ability to "write" Ages. Here, there's just this vague mysticism surrounding a tree/a grower, which I guess we're supposed to take on faith (ha) that it will somehow renew the civilization and "grow." Okay, sure.

Despite the problems with the story, however, this is a fun game, and a solid addition to the Myst canon. It's worth playing for the challenging puzzles and beautiful visuals. Just don't ask too many questions about why characters do what they do, like I do.. Let this game grow for another six months or more. There isn't really any gameplay to speak of. It's more of a tech demo at this point.. I actually really liked this game even though other reviews made the game seem pretty bad. Its very short though and can probably be bet in 2-4 hours depending on how bad you are at puzzles in games. I do recommend this game to all of you out there, but I also recommend you buy it on sale like I did since the price and length of the game don't seem to match up.. Quadrant starts out a bit slow. Chapter 1 has a ton of build up and it's kind of a let down once you find out what the first creature looks like. Chapter 2 is better, the creature on the ceiling is creepy as hell since I have a fear of spiders, and always having to look up gives me that feeling when I'm walking into a room looking around to make sure there's no creepy crawlies on the ceiling. The blood writing is a cool idea, but in general it took a little too long to figure out and kind of detracts a bit from the pacing. Overall, from what I have played so far, the game is a great attempt from a small team. It's not a bad game in all honesty, it has it's moments, and I think it's worth playing for anyone who enjoys anything in the Sci-Fi and Horror genre.. Game doesn't explain the controls or what you have to do!

Some important context for this review: I was mislead by the screenshots into buying this game - they make it look like there are subtitles, like "hearing" is actually reading. It is not. It is hearing sound, with your ears.

Furthermore, I'm not technically hearing impaired but have significant difficulty discerning words (I have to watch TV with subtitles or I literally can't understand the dialogue). However, I have little trouble with audiobooks because the voices are so clear, the audio quality so high, and there are zero other sounds to muddy the waters.

With all of that in mind, consider that I completed the first three puzzles. It was a struggle, but I did it.

The first was effortless.

For the second puzzle, I got all of the names but had missed two very important details because of the sheer amount of background noise. I eventually had to look it up because I felt like I was going crazy. No, I just literally couldn't hear the answer to the puzzle.

The third puzzle, I got all on my own - but was nearly \u2665\u266

I should have quit at the explosion. I should have, in fact, quit as soon as I was struggling to hear dialogue over background noise that physically hurt my ears to listen to.

I'm quitting now because I'm tired of struggling to hear, tired of the pain in my ears, and tired of playing a game that feels like work. It's the most exhausting game I've ever played.

TL;DR: Don't buy unless your hearing is 100% absolutely perfect, and your ears aren't hurt by high pitched sounds
